SBE Survey: PSTN/ISDN State-of-the-Industry Project. As technology advances, legacy systems become obsolete. Many broadcasters still rely on various telephony technologies, and in some areas it's becoming increasingly difficult to order some legacy services from a local telephone provider.

The Society of Broadcast Engineers, working with Comrex as a research partner, has prepared a survey to determine the current state of various telephony services. The data from this survey will be shared with SBE members and codec manufacturers. The goal is to create a snapshot of the current state of technology so manufacturers can better provide the necessary tools to broadcasters.

ATSC 3.0 SBE Webinar Available as Archive

On February 19, the SBE conducted a webinar on ATSC 3.0, the suite of new standards and practices for the next generation of broadcast television. This webinar was recorded and is now <u>available at the SBE website</u>. ATSC 3.0 is a system that will provide more services to viewers, but also requires a clean break from the technologies earlier-generation DTV systems. The system requirements include a call for a flexible



and more efficient physical layer, mobility, Ultra-High Definition (UHD) images, new solutions for audio, incorporation of new user technologies such as second screen, and incorporation of broadband connectivity. The webinar presents an overview of the status of the ATSC 3.0 activity from a technical point of view as well as the anticipated time schedule.

Leading the webinar is Dr. Richard Chernock, chief science officer at Triveni Digital. Chernock is chairman of the ATSC Technology Group on ATSC 3.0 (TG3) and chairs the AHG on service delivery and synchronization for ATSC 3.0. He was previously chairman of the ATSC Technology and Standards Group (TG1).


