Many of these issues can be overcome with a restructuring of the HD Radio signal, and can frequently offer an improvement in reliability of the HD Radio signal regardless of make of equipment in use.

This promises to be an interesting and informative presentation. Mark your calendar, and bring a friend or colleague.





**EAS News** Wednesday 2/6 RMT at 11:50PM was sent by Wisconsin Emergency Management as a CAP alert. It was composed as a text alert, and then a text-to-speech converter at the receiving end at ECB converted it to speech before sending it out on the State EAS Network as an EAS Alert. You will hear the synthesized voice of the text-to-speech converter recorded in your EAS unit if you check it before another alert is received. This was Wisconsin's second CAP-originated statewide EAS RMT, as we prepare for the CAP-based Next Generation EAS.














## Picture of the month
