A very unique program and opportunity for this month's program. If we start lunch at 11:30 we should be done with not only dining, but the business meeting by 12:45. It is a quick drive "up the road" to the WPS Fox Energy Center tour. A tour arranged by Steve Konopka through one of his contacts. Thank you, Steve, for arranging this tour.

The other issue I wanted to bring to your attention is an upcoming SBE Ennes Workshop at the NAB Vegas Show. The two days of intensive learning take place before the convention floor opens. Make your plans to attend and register now. It's only \$199 per person. (Registration required and is separate from the NAB convention registration.) When you register for the SBE Ennes Workshop, you will receive a code for \$150 off your NAB Show conference registration. There are two different tracks available:

One track is titled ATSC 3.0 NextGen Broadcast. Whether your station is already transmitting in ATSC 3.0, plans to in the future, or has no plans yet, it is coming, and you need to be ready for it. The sessions will discuss the standards behind the system, and dive deep into the implementation, from modulation to reception, including all the capabilities to deliver more than just video content.

The other track Is titled RF101 Boot Camp. RF101 Boot Camp starts with the electronics basics, but the sessions quickly lead into the generation, transmission, propagation and reception of radio-frequency signals. Various modulation methods of AM, FM, and TV are discussed, as well as studio-to-transmitter links, remote pickup systems, satellite, and microwave systems. Antennas, coax, filters and combiners, test and measurement, remote control and a section on AM directional systems are part of the two-day instruction.

#### 2023 SBE Leadership Development Course

The Society of Broadcast Engineers will hold the 2023 SBE Leadership Development Course August 2-4, 2023, in Atlanta, GA. This three-day course is an intensive study of successful leadership and management, designed specifically for broadcast engineers. The course explores the nature of leadership, the difference between being a manager and being a leader, how to build a winning team, the importance of attitude in the leadership position, communication insights and much more.



Instructing the course will be Dr. Abram Walton, founder of Ivory Bridge Group, a management consulting and training firm. He is also a full-tenured professor of management at Florida Tech, specializing in management and innovation. He serves as a U.S. Delegate for ISO 56000, on Innovation Management System standards and has been actively researching in the fields of innovation management, business analytics, and product lifecycle management for the past 20 years. He currently serves as the founding director of Florida Tech's Center for Innovation Management & Business Analytics (CIMBA). He has authored more than 100 publications and conference proceedings, and his textbooks on leadership and management have sold more than 15,000 copies.



# Gary Mach Excellence in Media Fund

The Gary Mach Excellence in Media Fund is inspired by Gary's achievements in broadcast engineering as he served several media organizations, businesses, charitable organizations, and most of all, UW-Green Bay and public broadcasting in Wisconsin. Through Gary's work in television production at the then fledgling Green Bay campus, he created opportunities to learn and grow for generations of broadcast engineers. Professional

development was always a high priority for Gary and the people who worked alongside him. This fund seeks to continue Gary's legacy on the campuses of UW-Green Bay by supporting facilities, creating opportunities, and offering financial support for students who aspire to professional careers in media. Harvey Arnold '75 provided seed funding and seeks alumni and media advocates to celebrate Gary's legacy with additional contributions.
